1. Open Port Electric Vehicle Tour

Incheon was the third city in Korea to open a port, following Busan and Wonsan. At its heart is Jung-gu, which embraces Incheon Port. Chinatown, Museum Street, and Songwol-dong Fairy Tale Village are all located in Jung-gu.
