1. Open Port Electric Vehicle Tour

Incheon was the third city in Korea to open a port, following Busan and Wonsan. At its heart is Jung-gu, which embraces Incheon Port. Chinatown, Museum Street, and Songwol-dong Fairy Tale Village are all located in Jung-gu. The "Port Story Tour" offered by Jo Eun Tours is a program that explores the area in detail in an eco-friendly electric vehicle.



2. Sinpo International Market

Shinpo Market is a well-known traditional market located in Incheon's old downtown area, near the Open Port district. It has a long history and is especially famous for **Shinpo Dakgangjeong**, a sweet and crispy Korean fried chicken that attracts many visitors. The market is lined with small shops selling a wide variety of street food, snacks, desserts, and daily necessities. Its lively atmosphere, affordable food, and local charm make it a popular place for both tourists and residents. Walking through the narrow alleys, visitors can experience the everyday life and food culture of Incheon in a casual and authentic setting.



3. Sangsang Platform

Sangsang Platform is a landmark cultural and creative complex located in Incheon's Open Port area. Originally built as a grain warehouse supporting Incheon Port, the space has been transformed into a symbol of urban regeneration, reflecting the city's transition from an industrial port to a hub of culture and creativity. The platform houses exhibition halls, performance spaces, and cultural content facilities, while its waterfront areas offer open views of the harbor. The combination of preserved industrial architecture and modern design creates a distinctive atmosphere that connects Incheon's historical identity with its contemporary cultural scene.
